GULF COAST ATHLETIC CONFERENCE HISTORY

The Gulf Coast Athletic Conference developed out of a series of meetings held over a period of almost four years. A number of private four-year schools in the Gulf Coast region with similar educational standards, enrollments, budgets, and athletic philosophies mutually felt the need for a conference.

In April and May of 1981 a constitution was developed, officers were elected and the decision was made to proceed with conference competition during the 1981-82 school year. Charter officers were Anthony M. Rachal, Jr. of Xavier University (president); John Burton, Spring Hill College (vice president); Mark Windham, Belhaven College (secretary/treasurer); and Thomas Howell, Louisiana College (commissioner). Charter members were Belhaven College of Jackson, Mississippi; Dillard University and Xavier University of New Orleans, Louisiana; Louisiana College of Pineville, Louisiana; Spring Hill College of Mobile, Alabama; Tougaloo College of Tougaloo, Mississippi; and William Carey University of Hattiesburg, Mississippi.

In August of 1981 the Gulf Coast Athletic Conference received recognition as an National Association for Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) Affiliated Conference. The University of Mobile, Alabama was admitted in October 1985, Southern University at New Orleans was granted admission in May 1986. Loyola University was admitted in April 1995 and Talladega College was admitted in April 1999 and Louisiana State

University-Shreveport became a member the following year. In May 2000, Louisiana College and Belhaven withdrew from the conference. In 2005, Hurricane Katrina forced Dillard University and Xavier University to cancel all athletic competition for the 2005-2006 school year and Loyola University and Southern University at New Orleans were able only to compete partially. All schools returned to competition in 2006-2007, although in most cases with a reduced number of sports.

In 2010, Belhaven College, Louisiana State University Shreveport, Loyola University, University of Mobile, Spring Hill College, and William Carey University left the conference. Edward Waters College and Fisk University joined in 2010. Philander Smith College joined and Talladega College rejoined in 2011. Voorhees College joined the conference in 2013. Fisk University withdrew in 2013.

Now in its third decade of intercollegiate competition the Gulf Coast Athletic Conference continues to position itself as place for talented student-athletes to play and most importantly to continue their educations.

The GCAC also understands its unique position as the only conference in the NAIA made up entirely of Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs).

In 2014, the GCAC welcomed a new commissioner, Steven B. Martin, who has brought an impressive record of success in both the collegiate and professional sporting worlds. Mr. Martin, who has worked for the National Basketball Association, the New Orleans Hornets and at GCAC member institution Dillard University, has made it the mission of the conference to modernize operations and to enhance the quality of the experience at GCAC events.



MEN'S BASKETBALL



The Dillard University Bleu Devils men's basketball team captured their second Gulf Coast Athletic Conference Men's Basketball Championship in two years, defeating the Philander Smith Panthers in the tournament final. Dillard's **Demetric Austin** (center, holding plaque) was named Tournament Most Valuable Player. Dillard finished with a regular season record of 24-7.

Dillard University's **Jalen McGaughy** (below) was selected to participate in the 4th Annual NABC - NAIA Shoot & Slam competition.

McGaughy, who led the NAIA in 3-point percentage during the entire 2016-2017 season, finished runner-up in the 3-point competition behind Carroll College's Zachary Taylor.





The Bleu Devils represented the Gulf Coast Athletic Conference at the 2017 National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) Buffalo Funds - Division I Men's Basketball Tournament.

The Bleu Devils defeated the Oklahoma City Stars, 86-65, in the opening round of the tournament before falling to Langston University, 87-74, in the tournament's second round.

The GCAC presented its basketball postseason awards at the 2017 Basketball Banquet. Talladega's **Marcus Brown** was named Freshman of the Year after leading all rookies with 9.2 points per game. Dillard center **Jalen McGaughy** was selected as Newcomer of the Year. McGaughy's three blocked shots per game lead NAIA Division I and he is also the nation's top three-point shooter at 51.5 percent. First-team and second-team All-GCAC honorees, the All-Defensive team, along with Player, Coach, Freshman and Newcomer of the Year were chosen by a vote of the league's coaches.

- named 2016-2017 Gulf Coast Athletic Conference Player of the Year.

Smith, a senior from Vienna, Ga., ranked first in the nation in offensive rebounding average (3.96) and total rebound average (12.28). He also ranked in the top five in defensive rebounding (8.32), scoring average (23.28) and total rebounds (307).

Smith was the GCAC leader in field goal percentage (.538) and rebounding and had the highest single scoring game of the season in the conference (52 vs. Dillard). In that same game against Dillard, Andravious Smith broke GCAC records for free throws made (23) and attempted (25).

Smith was drafted to Canada's Niagara River Lions in 2017. The Niagara River Lions are a Canadian professional basketball team based in St. Catharines, Ontario, that competes in the National Basketball League of Canada.



For the first time in its storied history, the Allstate Sugar Bowl Bleu Devil Classic aired on broadcast television. The second of two annual matchups between Dillard University and Xavier University's men's basketball teams was shown live on WNOL 38 in New Orleans, Louisiana on Saturday, Feb. 18. The game was held at "The Battlefield" at Dent Hall, located on the campus of Dillard University.

The event was a partnership between the Gulf Coast Athletic Conference, sponsor Styll Premium Alkaline Water and WGNO-TV.

WOMEN'S BASKETBALL



The Lady Tornadoes (19-8, 10-1) clinched their second consecutive GCAC regular-season championship. **Adriana Anderson** scored the winning points with 2:43 remaining, then Talladega shut out Xavier University of Louisiana in its final four possessions to earn a 56-54 Gulf Coast Athletic Conference women's basketball victory for the 2017 Tournament.

The National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) announced 141 Division 1 Women's Basketball student-athletes were named 2017 Daktronics-NAIA Scholar-Athletes, including Dillard University Lady Bleu Devils forward **Keona Favis**, who earned the honor for the second straight year.

Although she did not make the team or earn honorable mention, Trench — a 5-foot-2 point guard from Edgard, La., and a graduate of West St. John High School — garnered 5-of-30 votes from a statewide media panel.

The 2017 Gulf Coast Athletic Conference awards were announced at the conference's annual pre-tournament awards banquet. Talladega guard/forward **Tajanee Wells** and her coach, **Kevin Herod** took home the evening's top honors as they were named Player of the Year and Coach of the Year, respectively. Wells became the second consecutive Talladega Lady Tornado to be named Player of the Year, following guard **Shakeena Benton** last season. Wells is averaging 18.3 points, 8.1 rebounds and 1.6 steals this season and ranks in the top five in the GCAC in scoring average, field goal percentage and rebound average. She's also been named First Team All-GCAC in each of the past three seasons.

Herod, in his third year as head coach, has earned Coach of the Year honors in consecutive seasons. He led Talladega to an 11-1 conference mark this season as the Lady Tornadoes claimed their second regular season championship in a row. Talladega has an overall mark of 20-8 heading into the GCAC tournament and is currently ranked 25th in the NAIA Division I Coaches' Poll.

MEN'S & WOMEN'S TENNIS



Xavier University of Louisiana's men's and women's tennis teams continued to perform well under head coach **Alan Green**.

The No. 2 ranked Gold Rush finished the season with their 85th consecutive top-25 appearance, earning a bid to NAIA Nationals. The Gold Rush have been No. 2 in all 8 polls of 2017, and have the longest active NAIA streak of men's tennis top-25 appearances, with their first coming April 4, 2017. This year marked the Gold Rush's 9th post-season appearance.





Though the Gold Nuggets had a losing record heading into the post-season, they have five victories against ranked opponents and each of their losses came against ranked or NCAA Division I teams. This year marked their 11th appearance in the NAIA tournament.

The Gold Nuggets fell 5-4 to Indiana Wesleyan in the round of 16 of the NAIA National Championships.

The second-seeded Gold Rush fell 5-0 to top-seeded Georgia Gwinnett in the final of the NAIA Men's Tennis National Championship.

Xavier's **Karan Salwan** (above) was named to the 2016-17 Academic All-America College Division Men's At-Large Team, making him the school's first tennis player to receive the honor.

Academic All-America teams in the College Division are comprised of student-athletes from NAIA, Canadian and two-year institutions and selected by the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA). Beginning in 2008-09, eight XULA student-athletes have earned a combined 12 berths on Academic All-America teams. CoSIDA has sponsored the Academic All-America program since 1952. Xavier University of Louisiana's **Charlene Goreau** (pictured above) earned NAIA First-Team All-America honors for the second year in a row. Goreau — from Toulouse, France, a graduate of Raymond Naves School and a business sales and marketing major at XULA — was 15-12 in singles and 11-14 in doubles in 2016-17. She led the Gold Nuggets to five victories against ranked opponents and a No. 7 national team ranking. Goreau is the fourth Gold Nugget to make first-team All-America twice.

Goreau also received Honorable Mention for the 2017 All-Louisiana Tennis Team. A Louisiana Sports Writers Association panel of sports information directors selected the teams.

Goreau finished her 2017 season ranked No. 31 in the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) and No. 11 in the region. She and doubles partner Emma Kranendomk finished 13th in the NAIA and 9th in the region.

The Edward Waters College Lady Tigers softball team made short work of conference rival Talladega Lady Tornadoes (16-35) in the semi-final round of the Association of Independent Institutions (AII) Softball Tournament in at Grizzly Softball Complex at Georgia Gwinnett College. In the process, the Lady Tigers earned a playoff berth at the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) Softball Championship for the first time in program history.

The Lady Tigers ran into a buzzsaw in the #3 seed & 25th ranked Drovers from the University of Science & Arts of Oklahoma. EWC saw its historic 2017 season come to an end with a 14-0 defeat in their elimination game in the 2017 NAIA Softball National Tournament Opening Round-Alexandria Bracket at Generals Field on the campus of Louisiana State University-Alexandria.

The heated rivalry between the Edward Waters Tigers and Talladega Tornadoes basketball teams continued in 2017. Talladega continued its mastery over Edward Waters defeating its arch-rival 9-7 in dramatic fashion in the 2017 Association of Independent Institution (A.I.I.) Baseball Championship Semifinal for the second time since the start of the tournament.

Fresh off of his successful senior season, former Edward Waters star pitcher **Richard Edwards** signed a contract to play for the Trinidad Triggers of the Pecos League. Edwards is the second Tiger to sign with the Pecos League as former Tiger catcher.

Edwards, who will wear #61 for the Triggers, completed one of the most successful senior seasons on the mound in recent Tiger baseball history in 2017. In his swan song season, Edwards led the Tigers in innings pitched with 100.1, had a 2.60 ERA, an 11-3 record with one save, and 33 strikeouts. Edwards career numbers were superb as well, compiling an 18-10 mark with 10 saves, a 3.33 ERA and 62 career strikouts in 52 appearances for EWC. This season, Edwards was selected as an All-A. I. I. First-Team member and a member of the blackcollegenines.com Elite Team. The Triggers are based out of Trinidad, Colorado, about 200 miles south of Denver, and play their home games at Trinidad Central Park.

MEN'S CROSS COUNTRY



The 2017 Gulf Coast Athletic Conference Men's Cross Country Championship was the story of the unstoppable force versus the immovable object. Xavier University of Louisiana's **Camren Sewell** seemed destined to take the championship crown after inspired performances all season long, including crushing the school's 6k record by more than a minute.

The Edward Waters College Tigers, however, wouldn't be denied. Following the devastation of Hurricane Irma, most expected an untested Tigers team to show up at Conference. EWC's **Solomon Stevens** (top, second from left) unleashed a ferocious kick in the final meters of the race to overtake Sewell, who had been the front-runner the entire race.



Xavier's Sewell (left) was dominant over the duration of the season, establishing himself as Xavier University's top harrier. Sewell was named GCAC Player of the Week twice over the couse of the 2017 campaign.

A standout from Columbus, Ohio's noted LaSalle High School, Sewell--in his freshman season--set new records for Xavier University of Louisiana's Men's Cross Country program, Sewell broke men's cross country record for 6,000 meters at the LSU Invitational., running the course in 20 minutes, 8.1 seconds. Ray Walston set the previous school record of 21:08 in 2010.

INDOOR TRACK & FIELD



The Southern University at New Orleans (SUNO) Knights track and field team showcased their continued dominance in the sprints at NAIA Nationals, held March 2-4, 2017 at the David E. Walker Track at Gentry Field. Overall, the SUNO men's team came away with a third place finish with 39 points, their best finish since placing 6th last year.

Sophomore **Jahnoy Thompson** blew away the competition in the 200m finals, running 21.23 for a personal record in the sprint event. Thompson evoked a commanding performance throughout the meet, also cruising to victory in the 400m finals, with a 48.06 finish—more than 50 seconds faster than the 2nd place finisher, St. Ambrose's Michael Ohioze. Thompson was also named Men's Most Valuable Performer.

SUNO's men's relay team continued to impress, with a second place finish behind Indiana Tech in the 4x400 relay for **Danielle Richards**, **Alex Saunders**, **Acdane Campbell** and Johnoy Thompson.


Senior Alex Saunders placed third in the 800m run with a time of 1:54:19.

On the women's side, **Shadae Hylton** and **Kimona Smikle** placed second and third in the 400m final, respectively.





WOMEN'S TRACK & FIELD



On the national level, GCAC member institutions were the most competitive in the sport of track & field. In 2017, the GCAC saw a record 30 individual student-athletes recognized as NAIA-A and NAIA-B national qualifiers—a more than 50% increase from 2016. Southern University at New Orleans (SUNO) led all member institutions with 14 individual national qualifiers. SUNO's women's team was ranked no. 4 in the nation for the majority of the season, with 400-meter runner **Shadae Hylto**n and 400-meter hurdler **Kimona Smikle** both ranked No. 1 in their respective events.

Xavier's women's 1600-meter relay team of Janelle Jones, Tramaine Shannon, Clarke Allen and Ry-Anne Riley combined to cruise to a nationals-qualifying time of 47.98 seconds early in the outdoor season.

A week later, Xavier's women's 3200m relay team, composed of sophomore mid-distance specialists **Maliya Vaughn**, **Carlie Calais** and **Brianna Pace** and freshman distance phenom **Taylor Price**, broke the Gold Nugget 3200-meter relay school record at the Emory Invitational with a fourth place finish in the event and a speedy 9:58.68 finish time.

The previous school record in the event was 10:00.83.

Dillard University's hurdles specialist **Sasha Newman** placed 5thin the women's 100-meter hurdles, at NAIA Outdoor Nationals, down a spot from her 2016 finish. Newman would go on to finish 4thin the women's 400-meter hurdles, after tripping and falling over a hurdle during the 2016 contest. SUNO's **Kimona Smikle** placed 2ndin the event with time of 1:00.18.

SUNO's **Shadae Hylton** dominated the competition in the 400-meter dash, running a time of 54.41. SUNO would again take the gold in the women's 200-meter following **Argyana Bolton's** finish of 23.16.

The heavily-contested women's 1600-meter saw three GCAC member institutions vying for the title. SUNO's team of Shadae Hylton, Kimona Smikle, Argyana Bolton and **Orenthia Bennett** took the top prize with a time of 3:37.57

SUNO's women's team placed 3rd overall with a combined team score of 42--only a single point higher than the College of British Columbia.

MEN'S TRACK & FIELD



Southern University at New Orleans maintained their program's dominance this year in men's track & field. By April, the Knights had already produced 10 individual NAIA Outdoor Nationals qualifiers this season, with qualifiers in the mens' 100m, 200m, 800m and 1600-meter relays. The program received a major vote of confidence when Head Track and Field Coach **Yhann Plummer** and sprinter **Jahnoy Thompson** were selected as the U.S. Track and Field and Cross Country Coaches Association (USTFCCCA) South Coach and Athlete of the Year.

Several meet records fell at the annual GCAC Track & Field Competition, many at the hands of the Edward Waters (Fla.) College Tigers. Thrower **Greg Bradshaw** took down the meet record of 37.91 meters in the men's hammer with a throw of 41.94 meters to start the Tigers off with a win to begin the day. Coming in to the championship, hurdler **Carl Elliott, III** was ranked No. 8 in the nation, but rose to No. 2 with a 14.24 second performance to win the top spot in the 110-meter hurdles.

Dillard's **Quamel Sessoms** destroyed the previous meet record of 7.09 meters in the long jump with a final distance of 7.67 meters. Three teams saw their campaigns for national glory kept alive. Edward Waters (**Reginald Wright**, **Dontae LeCorn**, **Heiden Cummings** and **Wayne Richardson**), SUNO (**Chadwayne Vidale**, **Danielle Richards**, **Brian Smith** and **Jahnoy Thompson**) and Dillard (**Quamel Sessoms**, **Larry Trimble**, **Tyrone Barrow** and **Artis McCoy**) hit NAIA Outdoor Nationals qualifying times in the 400-meer relay. EWC's **Hieden Cummings** hit an NAIA-B qualifying time of 21.56 in the men's 200-meter dash.

Gulf Coast Athletic Conference (GCAC) member institutions produced a record 28 National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) All-Americans at the 2017 NAIA Outdoor Track and Field Championship.

All-America awards are bestowed annually on the most outstanding athletes in a sport.

On the men's side, notable newcomers for All-America distinction included the Edward Waters (Fla.) men's 400-meter relay team. The team placed 5th overall in the event with a final time of 40.93.

Edward Waters' **Carl Elliott, III** also received All-American honors with his 5th place finish in the men's 110-meter hurdles. Elliott receives this award as a freshman in Head Coach Archie Gallon's track and field program.
