GULF COAST ATHLETIC CONFERENCE HISTORY

The Gulf Coast Athletic Conference developed out of a series of meetings held over a period of almost four years. A number of private four-year schools in the Gulf Coast region with similar educational standards, enrollments, budgets, and athletic philosophies mutually felt the need for a conference.

In April and May of 1981 a constitution was developed, officers were elected and the decision was made to proceed with conference competition during the 1981-82 school year. Charter officers were Anthony M. Rachal, Jr. of Xavier University (president); John Burton, Spring Hill College (vice president); Mark Windham, Belhaven College (secretary/treasurer); and Thomas Howell, Louisiana College (commissioner). Charter members were Belhaven College of Jackson, Mississippi; Dillard University and Xavier University of New Orleans, Louisiana; Louisiana College of Pineville, Louisiana; Spring Hill College of Mobile, Alabama; Tougaloo College of Tougaloo, Mississippi; and William Carey University of Hattiesburg, Mississippi.

In August of 1981 the Gulf Coast Athletic Conference received recognition as an National Association for Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) Affiliated Conference. The University of Mobile, Alabama was admitted in October 1985, Southern University at New Orleans was granted admission in May 1986. Loyola University was admitted in April 1995 and Talladega College was admitted in April 1999 and Louisiana State

University-Shreveport became a member the following year. In May 2000, Louisiana College and Belhaven withdrew from the conference. In 2005, Hurricane Katrina forced Dillard University and Xavier University to cancel all

athletic competition for the 2005-2006 school year and Loyola University and Southern University at New Orleans were able only to compete partially. All schools returned to competition in 2006-2007, although in most cases with a reduced number of sports.

In 2010, Belhaven College, Louisiana State University Shreveport, Loyola University, University of Mobile, Spring Hill College, and William Carey University left the conference. Edward Waters College and Fisk University joined in 2010. Philander Smith College joined and Talladega College rejoined in 2011. Voorhees College joined the conference in 2013. Fisk University withdrew in 2013.

Now in its third decade of intercollegiate competition the Gulf Coast Athletic Conference continues to position itself as place for talented student-athletes to play and most importantly to continue their educations.

The GCAC also understands its unique position as the only conference in the NAIA made up entirely of Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs).

In 2014, the GCAC welcomed a new commissioner, Steven B. Martin, who has brought an impressive record of success in both the collegiate and professional sporting worlds. Mr. Martin, who has worked for the National Basketball Association, the New Orleans Hornets and at GCAC member institution Dillard University, has made it the mission of the conference to modernize operations and to enhance the quality of the experience at GCAC events.

In 2018, Rust College joined the GCAC as the 8th member of the conference.





Xavier University of Louisiana's **Mariia Borodi**i was named Intercollegiate Tennis Association/NAIA Women's National Rookie of the Year at a banquet for all teams participating in the NAIA National Tennis Championship.

Borodii, a sophomore from Zaporizhzhia, Ukraine, was 15-0 in singles — winning all those matches on the first court — and 15-4 in doubles with 10 victories in her last 11 decisions with **Yi Chen Pao.** Borodii is the only Gold Nugget ever to achieve top-3 national rankings in singles (No. 2) and doubles (No. 3). Borodii was the Region IV (South) winner of the award.



The Xavier University of Louisiana men's tennis team's bid for a third consecutive berth in an NAIA National Championship final ended when the Gold Rush fell 5-0 to four-time defending champion Georgia Gwinnett.

The Grizzlies (26-0) swept the doubles, then won two singles matches to advance to a 1:30 p.m. Saturday final against second-seeded Keiser.

Xavier's women's tennis team lost 5-1 at NAIA Nationals to two-time defending champion Georgia Gwinnett in the semifinals of the NATA National Championships.

It was the Gold Nuggets' first defeat after a school-record 16-dual-match win streak. They had not lost since Feb. 21.

A memorable season for Edward Waters softball came up one win short of making their second consecutive trip to the NAIA National Softball Tournament as the Lady Tigers fell 12-4 in five innings to GCAC rival Talladega at the Association of Independent Institutions Softball Championship at the Grizzly Softball Complex.



The 2017 Gulf Coast Athletic Conference Men's Cross Country Championship was the story of the unstoppable force versus the immovable object. Xavier University of Louisiana's **Camren Sewell** seemed destined to take the championship crown after inspired performances all season long, including crushing the school's 6k record by more than a minute.

The Edward Waters College Tigers, however, wouldn't be denied. Following the devastation of Hurricane Irma, most expected an untested Tigers team to show up at Conference. EWC's **Solomon Stevens** (top, second from left) unleashed a ferocious kick in the final meters of the race to overtake Sewell, who had been the front-runner the entire race.



Xavier's Sewell (left) was dominant over the duration of the season, establishing himself as Xavier University's top harrier. Sewell was named GCAC Player of the Week twice over the couse of the 2017 campaign.

A standout from Columbus, Ohio's noted LaSalle High School, Sewell--in his freshman season--set new records for Xavier University of Louisiana's Men's Cross Country program, Sewell broke men's cross country record for 6,000 meters at the LSU Invitational., running the course in 20 minutes, 8.1 seconds. Ray Walston set the previous school record of 21:08 in 2010.

INDOOR TRACK & FIELD



The Southern - NO track & field team won two championships and broke records at the 2018 NAIA Indoor Track National Championship in Pittsburg, KS.

The Lady Knights won two championships (400m Dash and 4x400m Relay), finished third out of 62 colleges with 13 All-Americans, and broke the 4x400m relay and facility records.

The Knights finished with six All-Americans and finished 27th out of 70 schools.


In addition, **Younne Reid**, in his first season as head track coach, won Coach of the Year for the Southern Region of the NAIA (National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics) 2018 Indoor Track & Field Season.







WOMEN'S TRACK & FIELD



The Gulf Coast Athletic Conference saw its second member-institution win a national title in 2018 when Southern University at New Orleans' women's track & field program amazed spectators and silenced detractors by placing 1st at the NAIA Outdoor Track & Field National Championship. The Lady Knights were masterful in each event in which they competed during Saturday's finals, earning a total of 64 points in just 6 events to take the NAIA's top title. The Lady Knights bested the University of British Columbia Thunderbirds by a mere 2 points, though the Thunderbirds fielded athletes in two more events than did Southern - NO.

Though Team Gold showed their preeminence in the distance races from the very beginning of the day in the women's 3000-meter run at the GCAC Track & Field Championship, the action really picked up in thewomen's 400-meter relay. It was a tight race between the Gold Nuggets and the Lady Knights with both teams pushing one other. The Lady Knights relay team of Oshin Brooks-Gilling, Argyana Bolton, Shadae Hylton and Kerry-Ann **Scott** broke the meet record of 46.40 set in 2016 by SUNO's Orenthia Bennett, Kimona Smikle. Brooks-Gilling and Ladicia Henfield by running 45.93 to take first place. The Gold Nuggets team finished second in 46.45. Both teams earned a bid to compete at NAIA Outdoor Nationals May 24-26 in Gulf Shores, Ala.

Joseph Moses' Gold Nuggets again placed first overall with 258 total points. SUNO's women scored 162 points for a second-place finish, while Edward Waters finished 3rd overall with 146.5 points.


Hylton, a senior in Head Coach Younne Reid's program, established herself as the most decorated female athlete in Southern - NO track & field history, amassing the single most All-America awards in program history when she took first place in the women's 400-meter dash at NAIA Outdoor Track & Field Nationals, and helped to anchor Southern - NO's women's 1600-meter relay team to a win in the event.

Hylton's leadership also contributed to the Lady Knights' awe-inspiring 1st-place victory overall at NAIA Outdoor Nationals in Gulf Shores, Ala.

Though he would retire shortly after the 2018 GCAC Track & Field Championship, Edward Waters Head Track & Field Coach **Archie Gallon** proved he has a winning formula for the Tigers men's team. The Tigers' men's team amassed 304 total points over two days at the GCAC Championship, owing in large part to the overall balance of Gallon's program. Gallon produced both the 2018 GCAC Track- and 2018 GCAC Field-Athletes of the Year on the men's side, as well as a number of individual qualifiers for NAIA Outdoor Track & Field Nationals--including the men's 400-meter relay team.

The 2018 Gulf Coast Athletic Conference Track & Field Championship shifted into high gear in its second day, with the full slate of GCAC track & field programs in competition. It was the first day that the Southern University at New Orleans (SUNO) Knights would compete, and both the men's and women's teams shook up the day 1 scoring almost from the start following Xavier's strong showing. Philander Smith and Dillard would also field the full complement of their teams.

Edward Waters' **Dontae LeCorn** went 10.76 in the event--his second-best time of the season--to take gold in the men's 100-meter dash. He defeated SUNO sprinters **Chadwayne Vidal** and **Rushain Edwards** to take the top spot in the sprint.

Though he didn't take down former Gold Rush runner Matt Pieri's record, Xavier senior **Chris August** took first place in the event in convincing fashion, overtaking Philander Smith freshman **Santerris Booker** in the final 300 meters of the race to prove there's still kick in his legs. August finished the race in 17:35.86, while Booker finished in 17:43.77. Edward Waters' **Gustavo Guzman** finished third at 18:40.8

All-America awards are bestowed annually on the most outstanding athletes in a sport.



Perhaps the story of the year for GCAC volleyball was the dominance of Dillard University senior Shelby Stewart when it came to merit awards.


